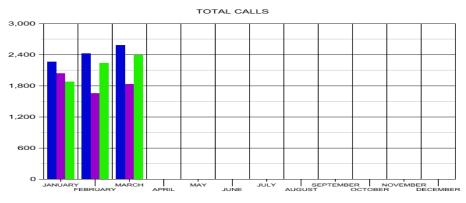




CROSSVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT STAT COMPARISONS YEAR TO YEAR— MAR 2024



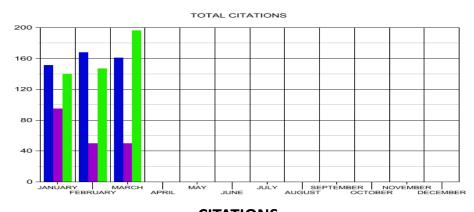

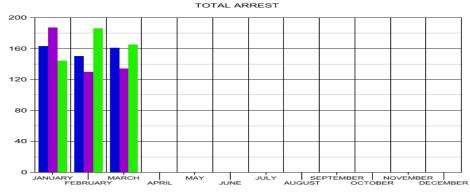

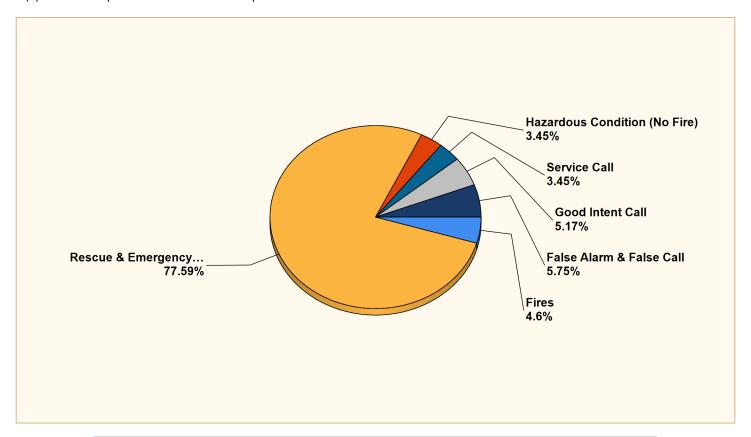
