




CROSSVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT STAT COMPARISONS YEAR TO YEAR— JAN 2023



Fuel sales were very slow in April. The downturn is in Jet fuel sales. Analyzing the year over year drop, last April we had significant Jet traffic in CSV. Also our main based jet customer was busier last year with both airplanes. I am not sure yet if there is a trend or the drop in fuel sales is an anomaly. We will watch it closely. Our prices are in-line with the market so I don't believe pricing is the issue.

We flew 150 hours in Crossville for flight training, up over down 30% from March. As we near the end of the two-year contract with the CCHS flying will drop off after the contract funds have been used up. Our overall flying across all locations remains strong with the demand for new pilots nationwide.

The maintenance shop remains busy. We are continuing to build our capabilities in maintenance to support general aviation aircraft. The demand for high quality maintenance exceeds the capabilities of the maintenance facilities in our area so we expect continued growth in maintenance. We are working on a contract to provide maintenance for a large flight school in the Nashville area that is now owned by friends of Azure. That will significantly impact the volume of maintenance.

We are planning on beginning construction on at least two 60 by 60 hangars this summer. That will leave two additional lots for a next phase when demand is there. Additional hangar capacity at Crossville is needed and will being more fuel sales and maintenance to the airport.
