

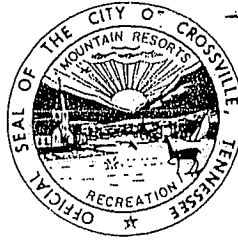

The Wastewater Treatment Plant personnel managed to save \$2,300 on the electricity for June. Our records are indicating that the bill for July will be the lowest bill recorded since the completion of the new plant. A TVA consultant will be at the plant on July 18, to review our program and make other recommendations that might save more money. This will be at no cost to the city. An article about the Wastewater Dept. and an aerial photo of the treatment facility was submitted to four magazine editors for publication in a fall edition. They all seemed very interested in receiving the article for publication.

Congratulations to our City Manager and Les Sherrill and his crew for sliplining the way to 100,000 gpd relief on the sewer moratorium. We have noticed about a 40% reduction of flow after heavy rainfalls.

#### CITY RECORDER - Sally Oglesby

At the last City Commission meeting, Kirby Hamilton of Barge, Waggoner, Sumner, and Cannon complimented the city employees on their cooperativeness in helping the engineers working on the water system survey. Their recommendations will be presented at the next regular commission meeting.

The commission is considering raising the water deposits for residential rentals.

Commissioners asked the state and local planning commissions as well as MTAS for their recommendations for a uniform annexation by referendum. Areas under consideration include Hwy. 127N across the interstate, Genesis Rd. across the interstate, Peavine Rd. across the interstate, Lantana Rd. to Pigeon Ridge, and Hwy. 127S past South Hills.

The commission is also looking toward developing surplus airport property into an industrial park.

Petroleum bids were read with the bids from Joe Lee Smith - Gulf being approved. The commission also approved the publication bid of the Cumberland County Times.

The State of Tennessee brought a proposal for the Miller Ave. By-Pass which was approved by the Commission. Bids are to be let in the fall of 1986.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT - Charlie Akins
