Fuel sales were strong again in November. The monthly number was up 52% year over year. Much of the increase has to do with the impact Covid had on last year's aviation activity. We continue to see good growth in transit fuel. Across the state of Tennessee general aviation activity is strong with the economy growing. We did not see any negative impact with the rise of Covid numbers due to the Delta variant surge a few months ago.

We flew 75 hours on the flight training aircraft in Crossville in November, which was down from October. The decrease in flying had to do with marginal VFR weather days in Crossville. Demand for flight training continues to be strong as the airline industry is hiring pilots again. We will start flying with the scholarship students from Cumberland County School system in January. Yesterday (December 8) we had a signing event at the airport for the first 15 students who will start their flying lessons. It was exciting to see the students and their parents there. This is a unique program that has never been done in the state of Tennessee.

Our maintenance shop continues to run at capacity. Our maintenance shop now has 4 full time mechanics and 1 part time mechanic plus Greg Livingston. We continue to increase our customer base and I would attribute that 100% to the reputation that Greg Livingston has in the aviation community for providing excellent quality maintenance at a fair price.
