I am writing to inquire about the use of Main Street (the parade route), only Main Street and the lawn adjacent to county clerks office. I would like to use it for Cumberland County's First Annual Remembrance and Recovery Walk. My Vision for this walk is to celebrate the people who have are in Recovery from addiction and to celebrate the lives that have been lost with their families. You may ask why celebrate? The answer is simple as a Recovering addict myself for over 18 years, living in addiction is like living in a nightmare filled with demons. You lose everything and everyone you love and anything else you can imagine. I came out with my life but I am living on God's time with a terminal illness that I have doubled the years I was given so now I work for God.

I believe by having this event we can bring attention to the services that are offered in our community. I personally have Nar-Anon meetings every week. This is where family members who have addicts in their family can come and through fellowship, hope, and strength we find a common ground and help put an end to enabling addicts which helps them seek treatment. Through that group I have developed resources outside and have sent people to detox, treatment, set them up with aftercare, and help get vivitrol for up to a year, all for free.

There are so many other resources here like what is being done in the jail with treatment, Drug Court, Bread of Life with Treatment, Cumberland County Rising, and those are just a few. Our county deserves the best and we have people like myself that want to get involved. People in Recovery want to help and so do the parents. Please allow this event to happen on September the first 2018. This is a significant day in the world of the people working the front lines and of those who have lost family members in the battle. The real date is August 31st. This is very significant to me because I have lost one brother, the other will die, one niece died, one nephew died, and another nephew is going to die as well. I am the only survivor of my parents children. It makes me very sad for them. I know this disease well. Enough of my personal story, now let's fight together for this county!

Please no more death.
