

Fuel sales were back up in August over July and about 50% up from last August. I believe this is due to people traveling more this summer.

We flew 88 hours on the flight training aircraft in Crossville in August, which was down from July. We had additional flight instruction in non owned aircraft with our instructor hours billed at 112 for August. We continue to get new student starts every month. We changed an engine in July for overhaul on the Blue 172. The Orange 172 is has been down for 30 days due to a scheduled engine change. Due to parts availability with the Lycoming we are borrowing an engine from an aircraft we recently purchased to replace the engine that was out of time. When the overhauled engine comes in we will put it on the new 172. We plan on adding a third 172 this fall to meet the demand as a result of the high school system starting their training program. We will put new avionics in this aircraft while waiting on the engine from Lycoming.

The maintenance shop remains busy to capacity. We are brokering a nice Cherokee 6- 300HP for the owner who is based in Crossville.

We should have a contract in place with the Cumberland County School System in the next 30 days. It is in the approval process. The contract includes providing aircraft and instructors for flight training and the leaseback of a Redbird Motion Simulator to be based at the airport. The schools estimate about 1000-1200 hours per year of training. Flight training should start towards the end of the year as students get through the ground training / classroom portion of their training curriculum.

The furniture in the lobby and pilots lounge (provided by the City from a grant) looks great and we are glad to have a new gas grill for cookouts thanks to Dr. Patterson.
