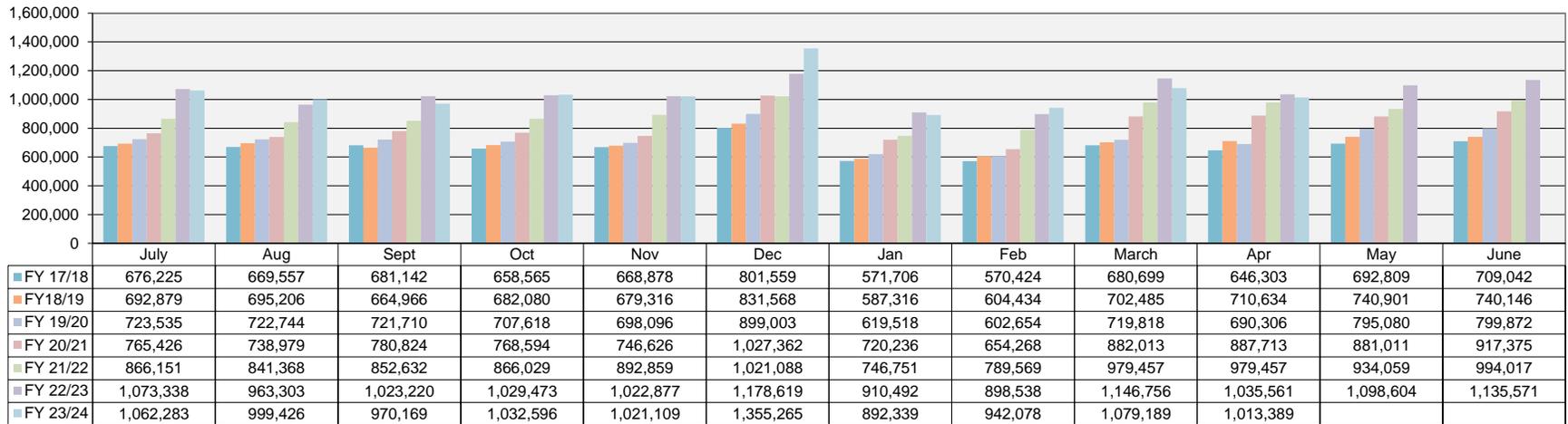
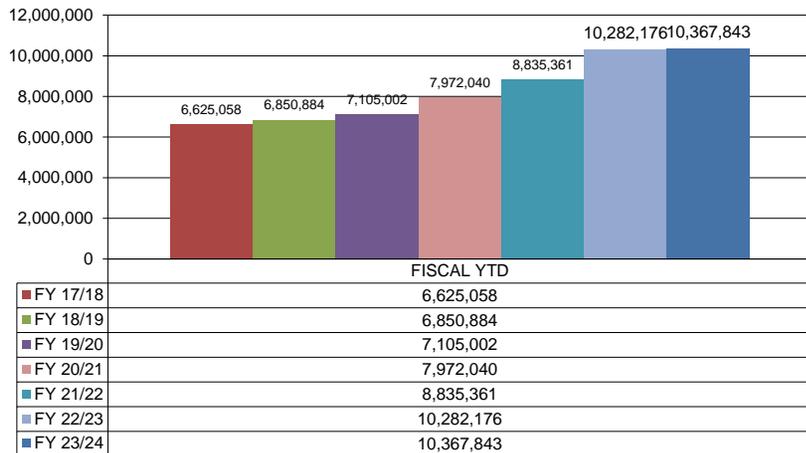

### Sales Tax Revenue Year-to-Date

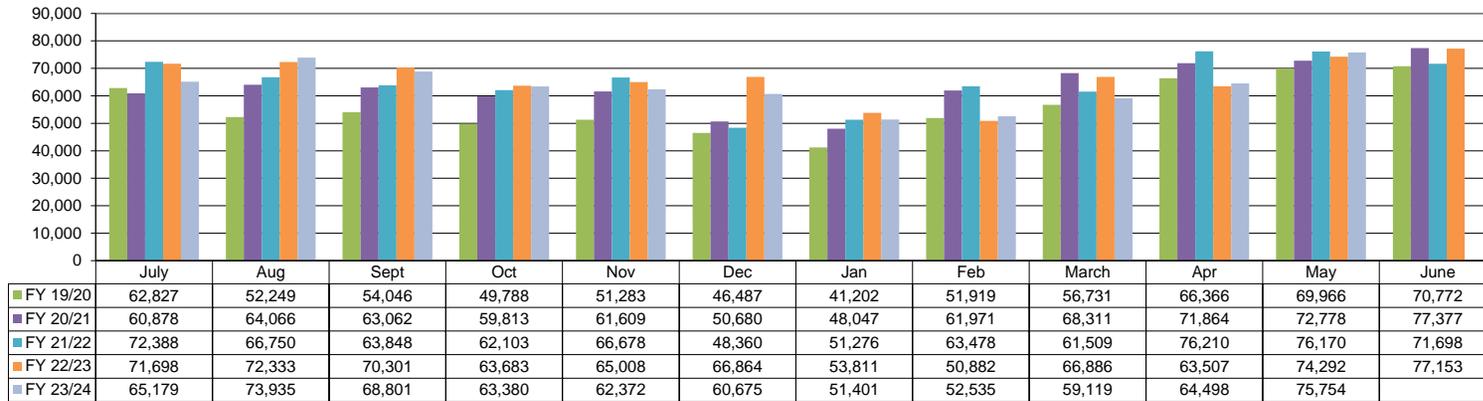

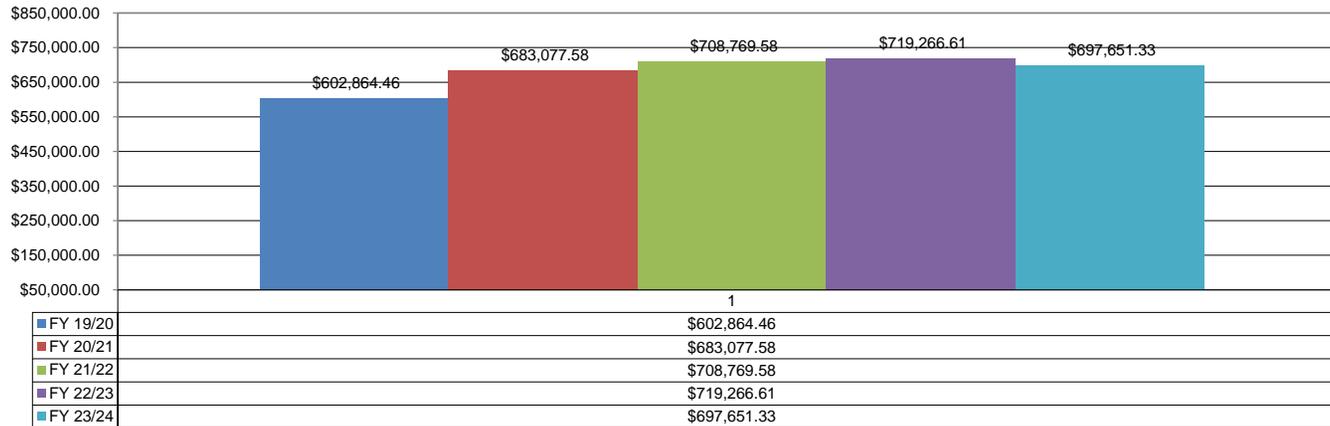

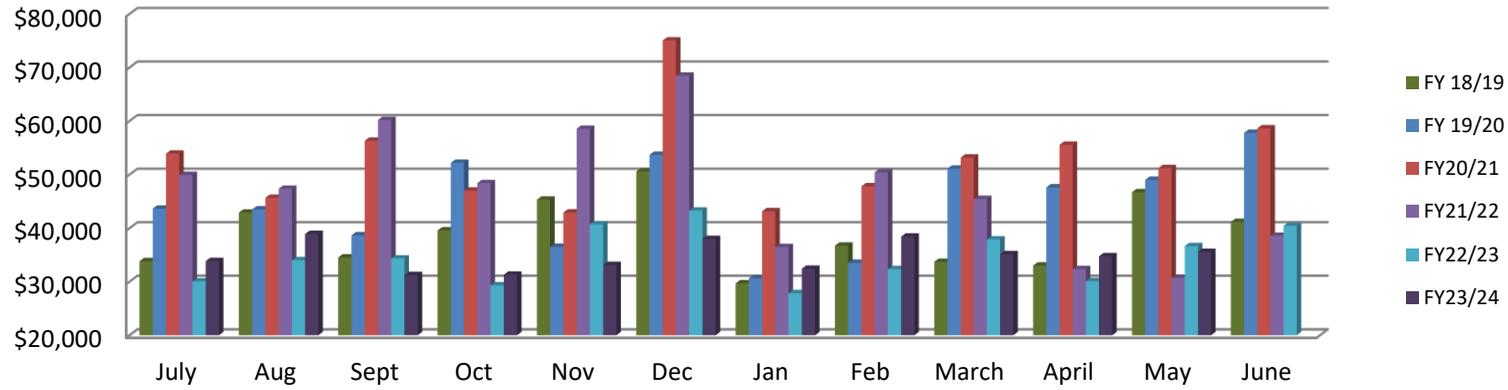
### Wholesale Beer Tax



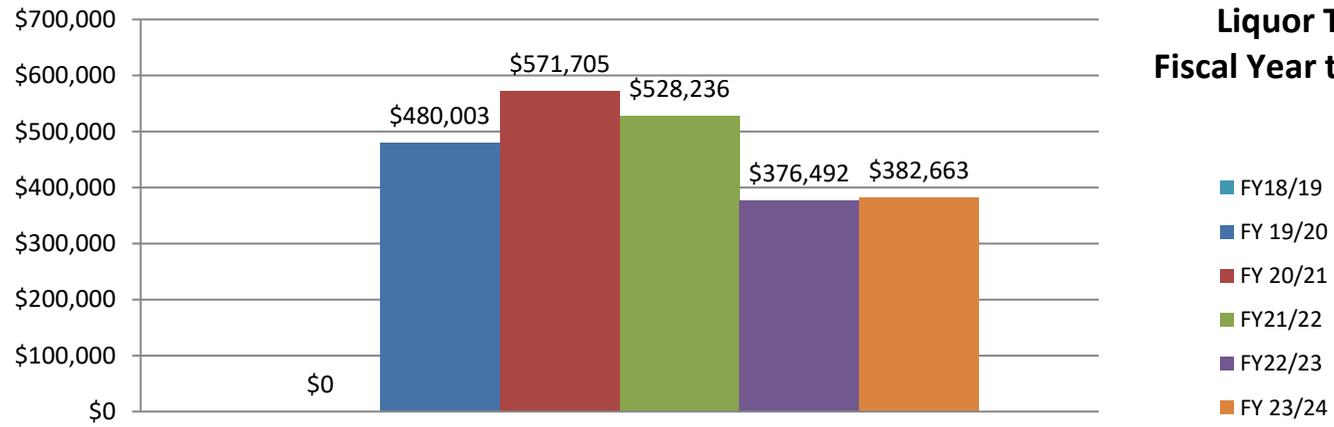
### Wholesale Beer Tax Revenue Year To Date

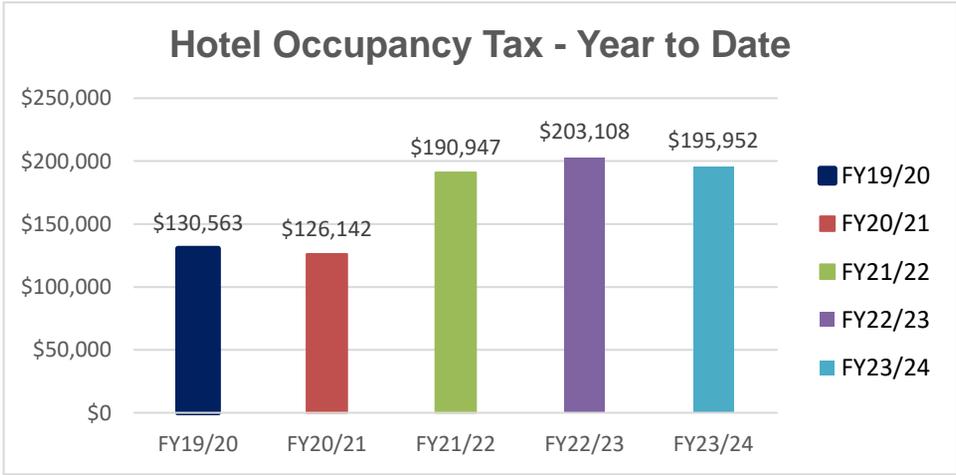
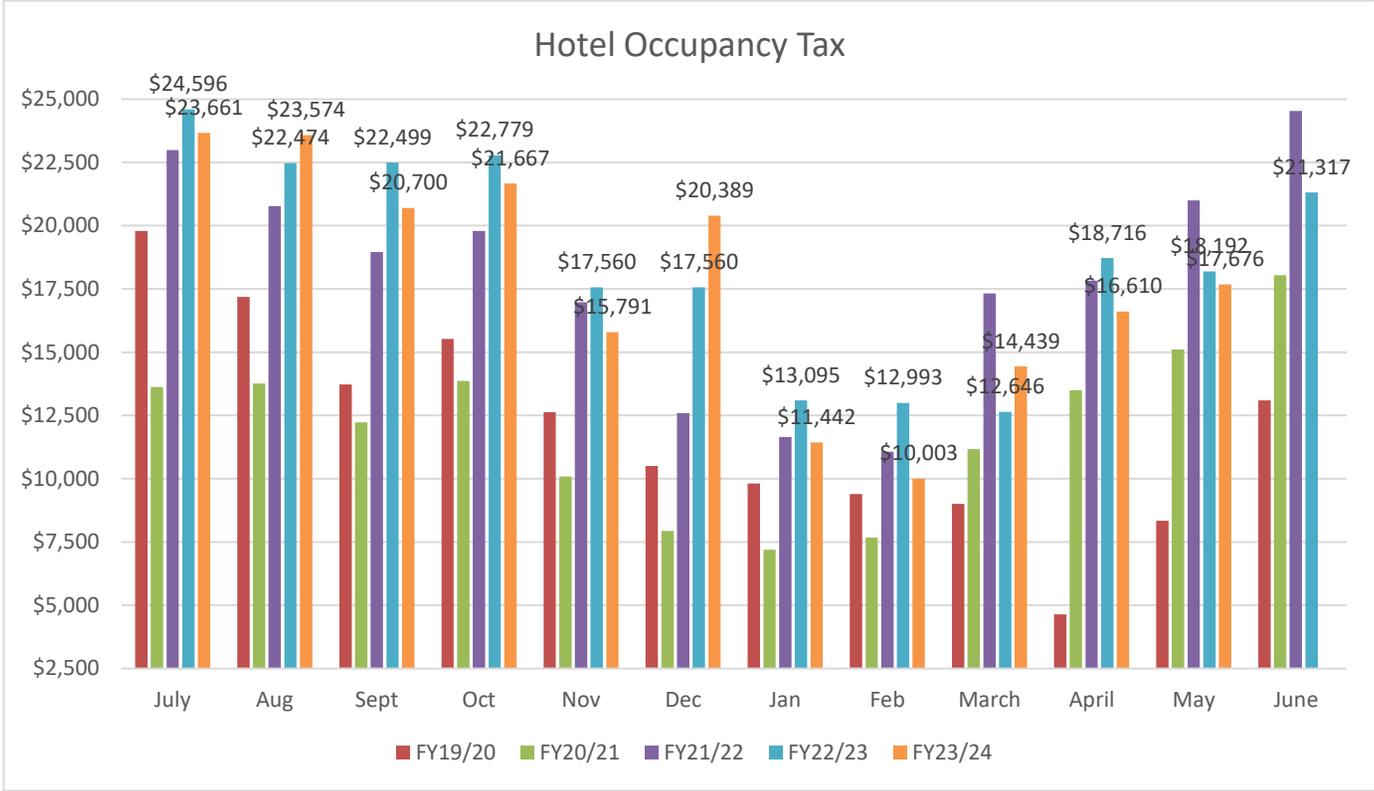


### Liquor Income

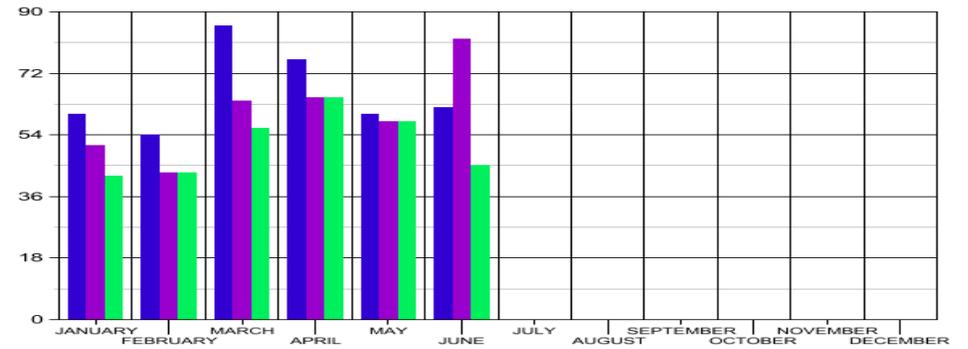

Fuel sales were up in June over May both in Avgas and Jet A. Year over year Fuel sales were down from last June 2023. General Aviation and Charter flights continue to be down industry wide which reflects in our fuel flow at our two locations.

The maintenance shop remains busy and fully booked.

We anticipate having our first jet aircraft in charter service in September. We now have fully qualified crews on the Jet but are awaiting the FAA to complete proving flights for adding a jet to our certificate. We have a second jet coming in August. Both jets will be based in East Tennessee at the Greeneville TN airport which is approximately 100 miles from Crossville.

We are still looking to hire additional Airframe and Powerplant Certified Mechanics full time to help us keep up with the workload of retail and charter maintenance.
