We had a great month fuel sales. The best Jet A sales month we have had since we started two years ago.

We flew 78 hours on the flight training aircraft in Crossville in May, which was down from 117 hours in May. We had one of the 172's down for a scheduled engine change. Flight training is back to busy in the first 7 days of July. Our other training locations had good months in June with 100 plus hours at each location.

The maintenance shop remains busy to capacity. We are rolling out two big jobs this week and next which will clear space for aircraft waiting to get in for annuals.

We purchased a Beech Sundowner and have it on the market for sale. We have two Crossville based pilots interested in the aircraft.

I met with Dr. Scott Maddox, Jon Hall, Mason Hall and Chris Bennett in Smyrna yesterday to show them a possible aircraft to buy for the Crossville high schools flight-training program. Azure is working with the school system to set up the program. They are ordering Redbird Full Motion Flight training devices (simulators). One will be based at the airport in the new room we acquired when the police department moved out to the hangar offices. We would like to carpet and paint the rooms we acquired so that when the simulator goes in it will look good.

General Aviation continues to be strong across Tennessee evidenced by fuel sales increases. Every maintenance shop owner we know is at capacity, everyone is seeing increases in fuel sales and used aircraft are selling at high prices.
