

CROSSVILLE — Commissioners on the building and grounds committee unanimously approved the use of the arena at the Cumberland County Community Complex at no charge for a day of music to benefit St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis.

Lynn Isham of Crossville attended the building and grounds committee meeting last week and requested permission for use of the facility from commissioners.

"These are going to be all volunteers and no musicians at this event are going to be paid. All of the money raised is going to benefit St. Jude Children's Research Hospital," Isham said.

According to the plan, the benefit concert will start around 10 a.m. on Saturday, May 5 and will continue until approximately 6 or 7 p.m. The concert will feature all types of music including bluegrass, gospel, country and rock.

"We have all sorts of local musicians and talent that are coming out of the woodwork to play for this event. St. Jude is going to come up here and help us with the event," Isham said.

He said the Cumberland County Rescue Squad, Cumberland County Fire Department volunteers and Sheriff's Department would help with food, parking and security during the concert at no cost to the county.

"This is going to be a good, clean event and day of fun for the whole family to come out and enjoy," Isham said.

Isham said he hoped the county would allow them use of the arena for that one day at no charge.

Donnie Moody, Community Complex manager, said there were no events scheduled that day in the arena because the annual American Cancer Society's Relay for Life overnight event is scheduled the night before.

"We normally don't have anything that next day after the Relay event," Moody said.

"Well, I don't have anything against this group at all and I know it's for a good cause, but we do charge for families who have benefits there. I know we have in the past," said 7th District Commissioner and

Building and Grounds Chairman Mike Harvel.

"Yeah, but this is different, Mike. This benefits thousands of kids every day and not just one family," said 3rd District Commissioner Johnny Presley.

Isham told the committee that it costs St. Jude more than one million dollars a day to open the doors of its facility.

"They help any and all children at no cost," Isham said.

Terry Carter, 6th District commissioner, made a motion to approve allowing use of the facility for one day at no cost for the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital concert benefit.

Presley supported the motion.

"I can see where it won't cost us much of anything because they won't need use of the lighting. That's where we get into the big cost and this is going to be during the day, so I guess it's all right," Harvel said.

The committee unanimously approved Carter's motion.
