"We shouldn't be here!" Reviewing Our Unlikely History

Christian Counseling Center began with the recognition of a need. In 2001, Cumberland County was officially on the federal list of underserved areas for mental health provision. Many local ministers were attempting to fill the gap, and Cumberland Mountain Mental Health did its best to serve the many needs. But many in our local churches saw that more help was needed.

In recognition of the great need, concerned persons representing 8 local churches met to discuss formation of a counseling center in Crossville. From that meeting, Christian Counseling Center was born.

Our first counselors, Pat Reis, LMFT and Carl Gundersen, LCSW, began seeing clients in September of 2002.

Since then our little agency has provided 8537 HOURS OF SERVICE HEALING HEARTS AND MINDS in Cumberland and surrounding counties. For a ministry that began with 2 patio chairs and provided only 5 hours of counseling in the first month, we have been incredibly blessed.

Our first board of directors adopted an underlying principle of our work: the Center will not refuse services to any person based on his or her inability to pay. Even in that first year, client fees provided only about a third of every hour of service. This ratio has proven to predict the extent of our need for funding ever since.

During 2016, that principle of providing affordable care to all almost outstripped our ability to keep our doors open. By mid-year, our numbers had shown a 30% to 40% increase over 2015. We were wondering if we would keep our doors open until the end of the year! But throughout our history, no matter how impossible things looked, we have seen with our own eyes that nothing is impossible with God.

We stepped out in faith, prayed for God's leading, and reached out to our donors. Many came through with generous donations. By year end, not only had we provided more hours to more clients than ever, we were able to do so with a small reserve fund for emergencies.






Total Cost per Hour
