Dear Everett:

I really enjoyed visiting with you earlier this week by phone. As I stated, Mayor Graham, during a City Council work session, lead a brief discussion on three items regarding our current working relationship and some possible future relationship with your utility district.

As you know, we have some sewer customers in the Peavine Road area. Crab Orchard sells water to these customers. I would like to further discuss some arrangement that would allow either the City of Crossville or Crab Orchard to collect the entire utility bill from these customers. At times, we have had customers not pay their sewer bill and we have no recourse to terminate their water service. I have thought of some possible alternatives to remedy this situation and would like to discuss with you for presentation to your Board.

You mentioned that you were somewhat aware of the need for our police department to have better internal communications. We have some dead spots along Genesis Road and Peavine Road. We are working with a communication vendor and it has been mentioned that your water tank near Peavine Road might be a good location for a repeater. As I stated, whenever we have more information from the vendor I will contact you to work out any details we need to.

Finally, the City would like to offer your utility access to water capacity of 1 MGD. There would be no take or pay fee associated with this. This could be used for emergency purposes, as in the past, or for future growth for your utility. I understand that you are in the process of increasing total future water capacity for your utility. Please let me know your thoughts on this matter and we can install and calibrate a meter between the two systems.

I look forward to having the opportunity to sit down and have further discussions on these matters.
