## Local option sales tax collections remain strong

Local option sales tax collections remain above budgeted expectations for fiscal year 2015-'16 according to Cumberland County Finance Director Nathan Brock.

Brock reported to the budget committee earlier this month during its January meeting.

Brock said December collections were listed at

\$721,045, \$29,098 higher than last December, bringing the total to \$170,084 above and beyond budgeted predictions for the year.

A total of \$3,723,030 has been collected in local option sales taxes since July 2015.

Brock reminded the committee those tax collections go toward funding the county's General Purpose School Fund

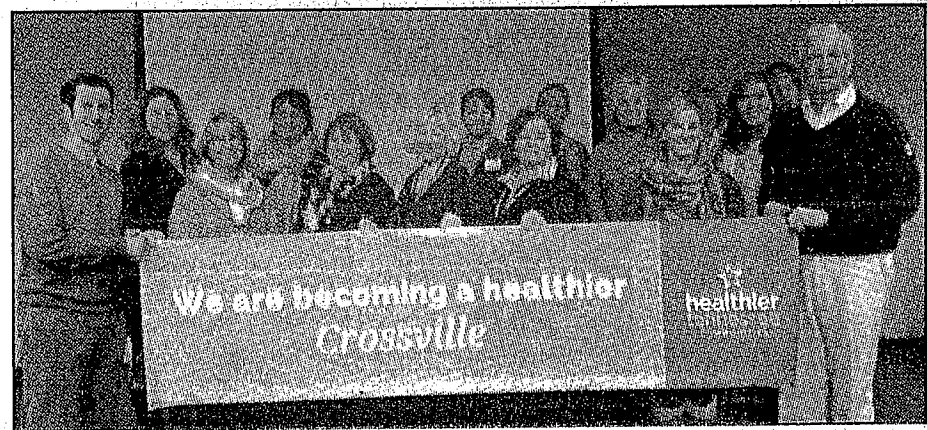
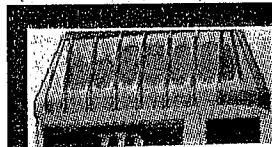
