Fuel sales were off in January due to weather. We started out very slow but picked up towards the end of the month. We had a number of days where the airport was closed due to snow and ice. We also had a lot of low IFR days. The monthly number was up 2% over last January 2021.

We flew 85 hours on the flight training aircraft in Crossville in January, which was down up from December and good considering how many non-flying days we had in the month. We started flying with the first scholarship students from Cumberland County School system in January as school started back and we will increase that as the weather improves and we put a third airplane on line in March. The third airplane is in a major avionics upgrade and should have been out two weeks ago. The avionics shop is experiencing parts issues with Garmin due to the supply chain disruption of computer chips. They believe it will be ready to fly next week. We have started training Whisper Aero employees. Mike Carter is doing a ground school one night per week with 9 students enrolled, and we have three of their people actively flight training.

The maintenance shop has stayed busy during the winter months and is at capacity with Greg and four mechanics.

I am optimistic about this year with the contracts we have for flight training, more transient aircraft activity, and a lot of retail work in the maintenance shop. All of this activity shows that Crossville Airport is a growing vibrant airport and also reflects that Crossville and Cumberland County is a growing economy.
