

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Non-Profit group known as the Crossville Shooting Sports Park, Inc. approached the City of Crossville and requested land to build a Shooting Sports Park which would be funded by TWRA and operated by the non-profit; and

WHEREAS, The City of Crossville and The Crossville Shooting Sports Park, Inc. held several meetings and work sessions where the terms of the agreement to transfer property were negotiated and mutually agreed upon; and

WHEREAS, The City of Crossville entered into a contract to sale certain real property to the Crossville Shooting Sports Park, Inc. on the 23rd day of February, 2017; and

WHEREAS, The Contract in Section 3.2 explains, "Purchaser understands that Seller is a Government and can only purchase or sale land subject to the requirements of its Charter and State Law. Seller understands and agrees that this contract is subject to the successful completion of all requirements including, but not limited to, advertising the sale of the property without public objection"; and

WHEREAS, During the March Work Session and March City Council meetings several members of the community spoke in opposition of the land transfer and have further submitted a petition in opposition to the transfer.

WHEREAS, Public objection to the transfer of the property in question has been clearly set forth.

Now, Therefore, be it resolved that the Crossville City Council mutually rescinds the contract for the purchase of real estate entered into on the 23rd day of February, 2017, by and between the City of Crossville and The Crossville Shooting Sports Park, Inc.
